MANYATA CLINICAL STANDARDS

ANTENATAL CARE (ANC) STANDARDS

01	Screen for clinical conditions for complications such as anaemia, hypertensive disorders, DM, HIV, syphilis, malaria during pregnancy (screens for malaria only in endemic cases), establish blood type and Rch at first ANC visit
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INTRANATAL CARE STANDARD AT ADMISSION

02	Prepare for safe care during delivery
	Ensure functional items for newborn care & resuscitation
	Ensure sterile/HLD delivery tray is available

03	Assess all pregnant women at admission
	Take obstetric, medical & surgical history
	Assess gestational age
	Record fetal heart rate
	Record mother's BP & temperature

04	Conduct PV examination, follow infection prevention
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05	Ensure respectful & supportive care
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06	Monitor the progress of labour
	Assess cervical dilatation timely
	Monitor the progress of labour
	Interpret partograph & adjust care as per findings

08	Assess and perform immediate newborn care (if baby cries immediately)
	Deliver the baby on mother's abdomen
	Use two towels at normal or pre-warmed room temperature
	Ensure immediate drying & assess breathing of baby
	Perform delayed cord clamping & cutting unless medically indicated otherwise
	Ensure early initiation of breastfeeding (within one hour of birth)
	Assess the newborn for any congenital anomalies
	Weigh the baby & administer Vitamin K

09	Perform Active Management of Third Stage of Labor (AMTSL) & examine the placenta thoroughly
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10	Identify & manage Postpartum Hemorrhage (PPH)
	Assess uterine tone and bleeding per vaginum regularly after delivery

	Identify shock	Manage shock
	Manage atonic PPH	
	Manage PPH due to retained placenta bits	

11	Identify and manage severe Pre-eclampsia/Eclampsia (PE/E)
	Identify mothers with severe PE/E
	Give correct regimen of Inj. MgSO ₄ for prevention & manage convulsions
	Facilitate prescription of anti-hypertensive
	Ensure specialist attention for care of mother & baby
	Perform nursing care

12	Perform newborn resuscitation if baby does not cry immediately after birth
	Step-wise resuscitation within first 30 seconds
	Initiate bag & mask ventilation for 30 seconds if baby still not breathing
	Take appropriate action if baby doesn't respond to ambu-bag ventilation
	Perform advanced resuscitation, if required, when chest rises & heart rate is < 60 per minute

13	Ensure care of newborn with small size at birth
	Facilitate specialist care in newborn weighing <1800 gm
	Facilitate assisted feeding whenever required
	Facilitate thermal management including kangaroo mother care

BEYOND DELIVERY:

14	Adhere to universal infection prevention protocols
	Process instrument & re-usable items adequately after each use
	Verify the availability & functionality of equipment
	Segregate biomedical waste & disposed of as per the guidelines
	Perform hand hygiene before & after each procedure, wear sterile gloves

POSTNATAL CARE STANDARD

15	Offer postpartum care package to the mother & baby, at discharge
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C-SECTION STANDARD

16	Provider reviews clinical practices related to C-section at regular intervals
	Determining the need of C section as per indication, making sure that the operation theatre is adequately equipped, ensuring adequate antenatal, intrapartum and postpartum care for pregnant mother and newborn and reviewing C-section cases through a clinical audit once every quarter.

MANYATA FACILITY STANDARDS

01

Provides curative & RMNCH services such as functional labour room/ OT, family planning counselling, functional newborn resuscitation and referral services. In addition, the facility has equipments ready for normal/assisted/caesarean section and laboratory services.

02

Has safe secure infrastructure for delivery of assured services, as per the prevalent norms.

03

Provides patient friendly environment and undertakes patient/attendant/community education activities.

04

Has equipment & instruments required for assured list of services and has program for maintenance and calibration of equipment.

05

Defines procedures for storage, inventory management and dispensing of drugs and procedures for safe drug administration.

06

Establishes procedures for patient identification, nursing care, and informing patients about medical condition and treatment.

07

Maintains and update patients clinical records.

08

Adequately staffed with trained manpower and conducts continuous capacity building trainings for maintaining quality services at the facility

09

Improves quality as well as measures clinical care & safety, basis patient feedback. In doing so, the facility reviews service quality indicators, ensuring quality assurance through internal assessments and audits.

10

Defines procedures for preoperative assessment, preparation and monitoring of the patients during surgery and anesthesia.
