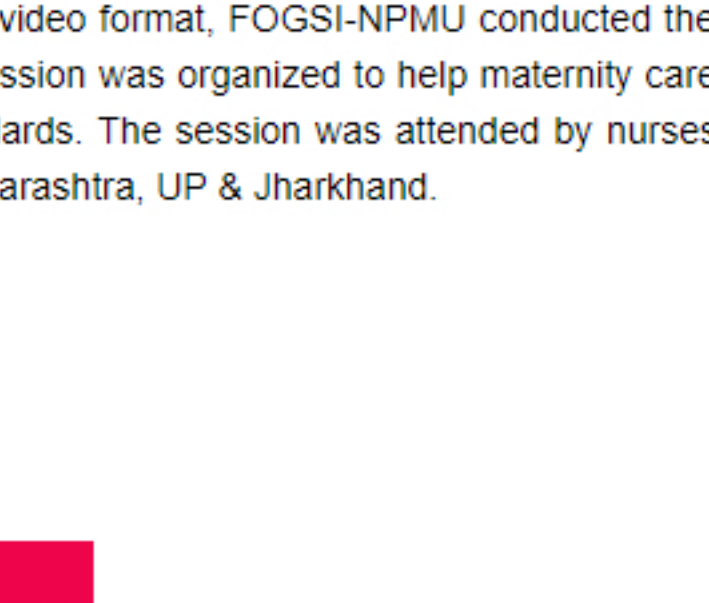
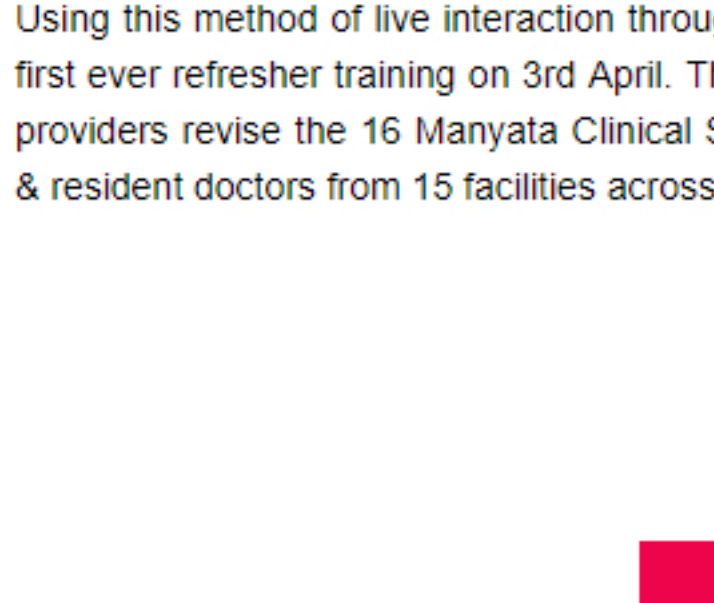

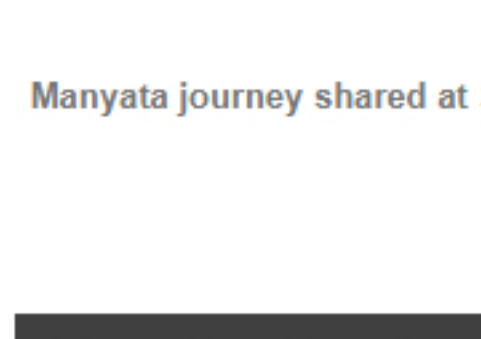

Manyata Refresher Sessions on Project ECHO

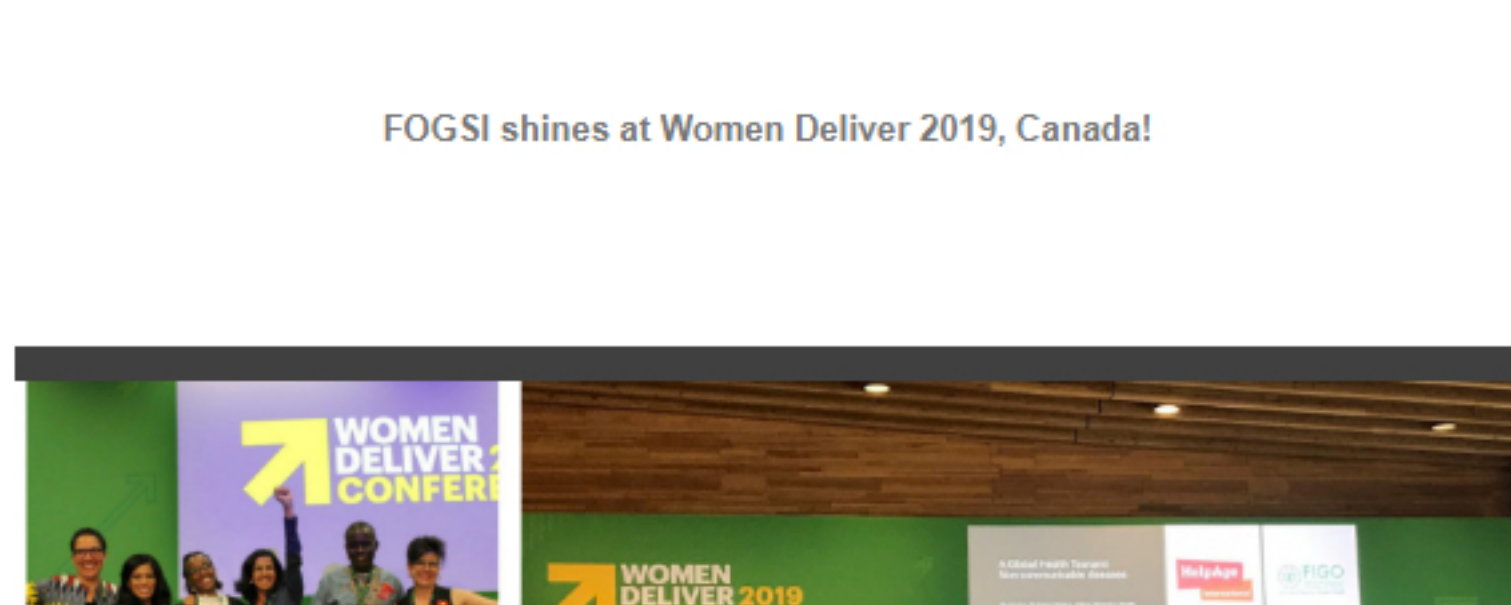
Project ECHO, a digital blended learning platform, aims to optimize healthcare delivery in India by addressing the challenge of knowledge transfer in the healthcare sector.

By using case-based learning modalities and sharing of best practices between healthcare providers, ECHO ensures accessibility of specialty care in urban and rural diaspora. The platform facilitates interactions between health workers asynchronously through the exchange of video and image files to be reviewed later or synchronously in real-time exchanges.

Using this method of live interaction through a video format, FOGSI-NPMU conducted the first ever refresher training on 3rd April. The session was organized to help maternity care providers revise the 16 Manyata Clinical Standards. The session was attended by nurses & resident doctors from 15 facilities across Maharashtra, UP & Jharkhand.

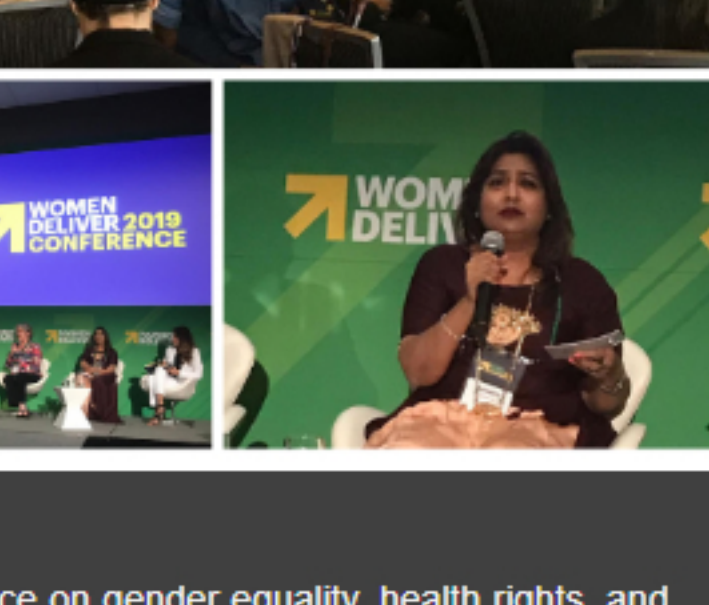
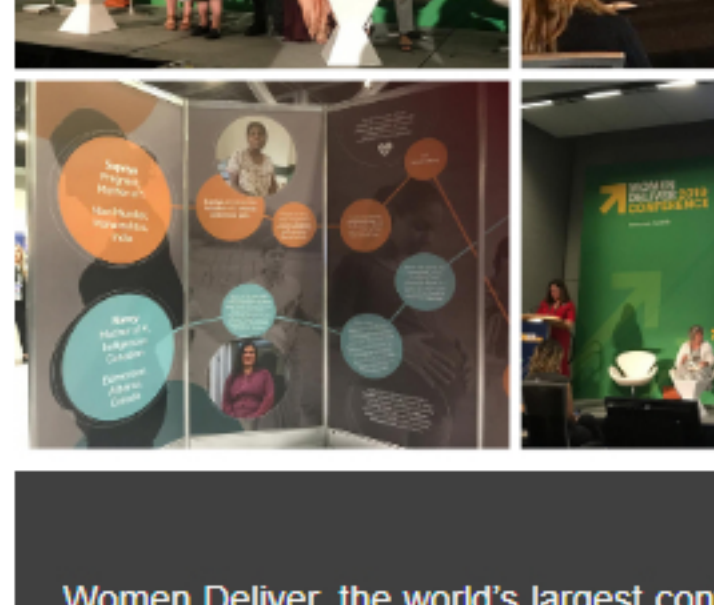
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Manyata journey shared at South Asia Federation of Obstetrics and Gynecology (SAFOG)

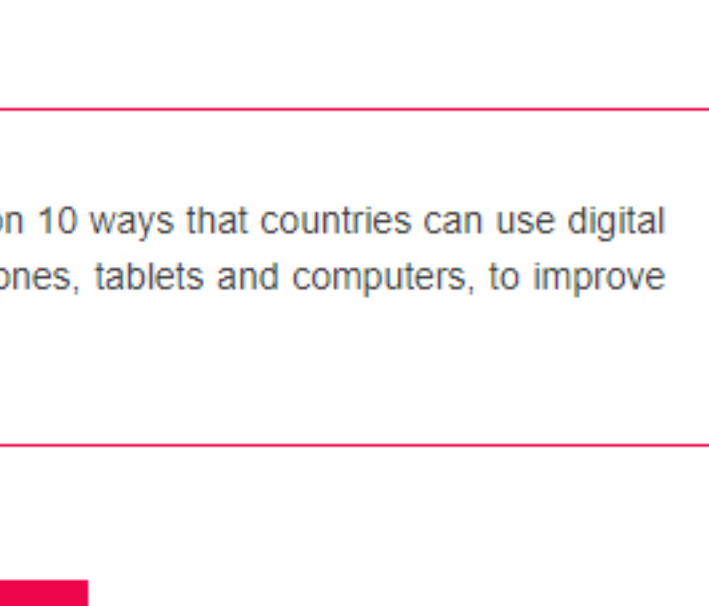
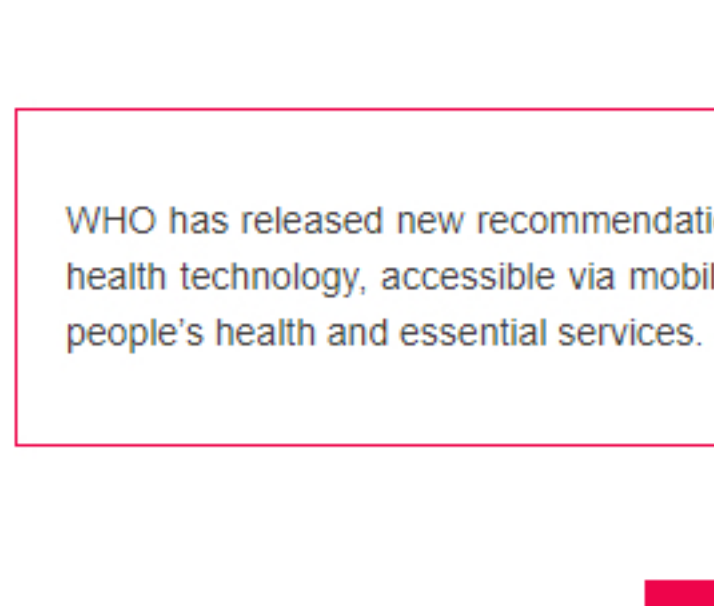
Manyata at Ranchi Obstetrics & Gynecology Society (ROGS)

Steering Committee Meeting at FOGSI Headquarter, Mumbai



The Steering Committee meeting on 18th April at FOGSI Office in Mumbai was attended by all the key stakeholders to discuss and crystallize the strategy and implementation plan for Manyata Phase III.

The inclusion of 10 facility standards in Manyata program was one of the significant outcomes of this meeting. On the formal inclusion of the new standards within the program, the facilities will require to attain a minimum score of 85% for clinical standards and minimum 50% for facility standards, to receive Manyata certification.

FOGSI shines at Women Deliver 2019, Canada!



Women Deliver, the world's largest conference on gender equality, health rights, and wellbeing of girls and women was organized from 3rd to 6th June, 2019 in Vancouver, Canada. Dr. Nandita Palshetkar (FOGSI President, 2019) and Dr. Hema Divaker (Manyata Convener and recent recipient of Global Asian Award 2019), participated as panelists for different sessions pertaining to maternal health.

At the session, Re-Thinking Women's Health: Gender-Based Innovative Science for Integrated Health Systems, Dr. Nandita Palshetkar, FOGSI President discussed the need for quality improvement and integrated delivery systems to achieve maternal health Sustainable Development Goals. She highlighted FOGSI's initiatives, in India, towards building a momentum for quality care and for bringing it to the forefront of the discourse to address maternal mortality. In this context, Dr. Palshetkar, also highlighted Manyata's contribution in standardizing quality care for private maternity care providers, creating value for patients, providers, and improving health systems.
